EVANS STANDING OUT EARLY

- Ken Evans Jr. is leading the way for the Tigers averaging 22 points per game while shooting 50.9 percent from the floor in his first four games for Jackson State.
- Evans has scored double digits in each game this season and putting up career-high numbers with scoring and is now at 33 following the Tigers games against LMU.
- Evans has scored 90 points and he is now 233 points away from becoming yet another to score 1000 points in his career.

LAST TIME OUT

- Ken Evans Jr. scored a career-high 33 points, but the Jackson State men's basketball team fell to the Loyola Marymount Lions 88-66 on the road Tuesday night inside Gersten Pavilion.
- Evans Jr. added five rebounds and two steals to accompany his 33-point game to lead the Tigers (0-4). Jordan O'Neal scored 10 points, and Keiveon Hunt chipped in with four points and two steals coming off the bench.
- Jackson State forced 13 Loyola Marymount turnovers while committing 12 themselves in Tuesday's game. The Tigers turned those takeaways into 11 points on the offensive end of the floor. Evans Jr.'s two steals led the way for the Tigers.

- Jackson State got a team-high eight rebounds from Coltie Young.
- Evans Jr. and Jordan O'Neal carried the load for the Tigers, accounting for 65 percent of their points.
- The Jackson State defense forced 13 turnovers.
- Evans Jr. led the Tigers with a game-high 33 points.
- Jackson State got five rebounds from both Zeke Cook and Evans Jr.

LOOK WHO'S BACK!

- The Tigers welcomed back all five of their starters from a year ago: Ken Evans, Coltie Young, Romelle Mansel, Chase Adams, and Zeke Cook, and they accounted for 1,510 of Jackson State's 2,232 total points a year.
- Evans led the team in scoring, averaging 11.3 ppg, 4.6 rebounds per game, and 86 assists.
- Young was the second-leading scorer, with 10.9 points per game and 3.6 rebounds per game.
- Mansel finished the year with 8.9 points per game, 31 block shots, and an average of 5.4 rebounds per game.
- Adams guided the team as the point guard and finished with 118 assists, 50 steals, and 8.0 points per game.
- Cook averaged 5.9 rebounds per game with 16 blocks and 35 steals.

2 DOGS 1 BONE

- The Jackson State men's basketball team lives on the 2 Dogs, 1 Bone philosophy.
- In the words of Coach Mo, "When you have two dogs in a kennel with one bone, the toughest and hungriest dog is going to get that bone."
- The team that works the hardest and puts in the most work is going to win the battle between the two teams.
- The Tigers have a championship mindset because they want to be the best team in the SWAC.

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Jackson State Tigers will clock quite a few miles on the road before the SWAC season begins. In fact, they will travel 9,736 miles before they play their first conference game.
- The travel is designed so the Tigers can grow together as a team on the road and learn how to play when traveling in the SWAC.
- JSU will play three games in five days in two different time zones to start the season.
- Following those three games, they will then play three more games over the next six days, all on the road.

BIG FROM THE BENCH

- Coach Mo is looking for a big thing from the bench this year. He added some key players who he is expecting to give key minutes and play well when their time is called.
- Some of those players include Treyon Johnson, Keiveon Hunt, and Jalani Bell.
- The Tigers scored 19 points off the bench in their first game against Memphis

SWAC PRESEASON HONORS

- Chase Adams, Romelle Mansell, and Ken Evans Jr. received Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) first and second-team preseason honors, while the Tigers were selected to finish fourth in the SWAC.
- Adams averaged 8.0 points, 3.7 assists, and 2.5 rebounds per game, and he shot over 80 percent from the charity stripe last season. He scored a JSU career-high 21 points in a road contest against Bethune-Cookman last season on his way to earning first-team SWAC preseason honors.

- Mansell averaged 8.9 points per game for the Tigers a year ago. He also had 5.4 rebounds and shot over 55 percent from the floor. Mansell scored his JSU career-high 24 points at Florida A&M and grabbed 14 rebounds against Abilene Christian.
- Evans Jr. led the Tigers last season with 11.3 ppg, as he started 31 of Jackson State's 32 games a season ago. He scored in double figures in 19 games last season, with two of those games scoring over 20 points. He opened the 2022-23 season by scoring double figures in the first six games.
- The Tigers, under the direction of second-year head coach Mo Williams, received 213 votes along with three first-place votes and were selected to finish fourth. Jackson State finished the 2022-23 season with a 14-19 overall record and a 12-6 record in league play, which was good enough for a third-place finish.

TIGERS TO PLAY IN HBCU CHALLENGE

- The Chris Paul Family Foundation and Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame announced the third annual circuit of two Historically Black College and University (HBCU) events, the HBCU Tip-Off and Challenge, presented by the AEA Foundation.
- The HBCU Tip-Off will take place November 18-19 at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Connecticut, and the HBCU Challenge will be held December 16-17 at the Michelob ULTRA Arena at Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino in Las Vegas.
- Jackson State will face Howard and North Carolina A&T in Las Vegas, with both games being broadcast on ESPN.

TOUGH SLATE

- Jackson State opens the 2023-24 season by playing three games in five games by playing at Memphis, San Diego, and Cal Baptist.
- The Tigers will face ten teams that made the NCAA tournament a year ago, including a team in Houston that made it to the Sweet 16 last year and Gonzaga, who made it to the Elite Eight.
- They will travel on the road as they face all 10 of those teams, with the exception of Texas Southern, whom they will also play at home.

TIGER TAILS

- Coach Mo is in his third year as head coach and second at Jackson State, his hometown. Born in Jackson, Miss.
- Williams attended Murrah High School, where he had a successful career, earning him a scholarship to Alabama.
- In his first year at Jackson State, he went 12-6 in SWAC play despite being picked to finish seventh.

TIGERS ON ESPN PLATFORMS

- Jackson State's men's basketball team will travel quite a bit to start the season, but fans will get a chance to see them on either ESPN+ or ESPN.
- The Tigers' first six games will be on ESPN+, and they will have a total of eight of their non-conference games broadcast on ESPN+ and two on ESPN.
- They will also play two home games on ESPN+ when they host Texas Southern and Southern in the Williams Athletics and Assembly Center.

TIGERS ON JSU SPORTS NETWORK

- Rob Jay will host the JSU Sports Network broadcast of each Jackson State men's basketball home game.
- There will be many chances for fans to see the Tigers in action this season, including two games on HBCUGO.
- The Tigers will be on HBCUGO on three different occasions when they host Alcorn State on January 6, against Grambling on February 3, and finally against Mississippi Valley State on March 9 at home.

HEAD COACH MO WILLIAMS

SECOND SEASON AT JACKSON STATE • THIRD YEAR OVERALL • ALABAMA



Williams defied the odds of a predicted seventh-place finish in his first season as he led the Tigers to a tie for third place and a berth in the SWAC Tournament semifinals. A win over SMU sparked the Williams era during non-conference play en route to a 12-6 conference record.

SWAC play was highlighted by wins over eventual regular season co-champ Alcorn and eventual tournament champion Texas Southern, as JSU won seven of its last eight regular season games prior to the conference tournament.

The Jackson native and former Murrah High School star returned home as head coach of the Tigers after spending the previous two seasons as head coach at Alabama State University. In his final season, the Hornets ranked in the top four in the SWAC in scoring, assists, three-point field goal percentage, free throw percentage, and blocked shots.

Williams entered the coaching ranks at Cal-State Northridge as an assistant coach under his former college coach, Mark Gottfried, whom Williams played for at Alabama. Cal State Northridge led the Big West Conference in scoring in both seasons, setting school records for three-point field goals made, field goals made, fewest turnovers, and blocked shots.

Williams spent 14 years in the NBA, averaging over 13 points and nearly five assists per game. Drafted by Utah, Williams would play his rookie season with the Jazz before spending the next four seasons with the Milwaukee Bucks. Williams played three seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers (2008-11) where he teamed up with LeBron James and helped the Cavs post a league-best 66 wins in 2008-09 and a berth in the NBA Finals. Williams was selected to the NBA All-Star Game in his first season with Cleveland.

After stints with the Los Angeles Clippers (2011-12), Portland Trail Blazers (2013-14), Minnesota Timberwolves (2014-15) and Charlotte Hornets (2015), Williams returned to Cleveland for the 2015-16 campaign as the Cavaliers completed an historic comeback from a three-game-to-one deficit to defeat the Golden State Warriors to win the NBA Championship.

Williams was named Mr. Basketball during his senior year at Murrah High in 2001 and earned McDonald's All-America and Parade Magazine third-team All-America honors. He went on to play two seasons at Alabama, averaging more than 13 points and four assists per game. Williams was named Sporting News National Freshman of the Year and Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year in 2002, helping lead The Tide to the SEC regular season championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. Williams earned third-team all-conference accolades in 2003 before turning pro after his sophomore year.

Williams has seven sons – Kydarrius, Maurice, Michael, Mason, Maxwell, Asa, and Ezra. A native of Jackson (Miss.), he is the son of Griceldia and Isaiah Williams and has three siblings – Marcia, Michael (a West Point graduate) and Montrell. Williams is married to his wife, Antonia.
