OPENING TIP

JACKSON STATE-GEORGETOWN

- This will be the second meeting between Georgetown and Jackson State.
- The first meeting was on January 2, 1991, in a game the Tigers lost 54-78

EVANS STANDING OUT EARLY

- Ken Evans Jr. is leading the way for the Tigers, averaging 18.5 points per game while shooting over 50 percent from beyond the 3-point arc for the Tigers.
- He is 12th in the NCAA in points with 111 points scored, which puts him 3rd in the SWAC.
- Evans has scored double digits in five of Jackson State's six games this season, scoring a career-high 33 points against LMU on the road.
- Evans has scored 111 points this season, and he is now just 212 points away from becoming yet another Jackson State great to score at least 1000 points in his career.

LAST TIME OUT | JACKSON STATE 73, MISSOURI 72

- The Jackson State men's basketball team put everyone on notice after their 73-72 win over SEC foe Missouri. Chase Adams knocked down a buzzer-beating shot with only three seconds left to lead the Tigers past Missouri on the road.
- Ken Evans had 20 points and three steals to lead the Tigers, with three players scoring in double figures. Jordan O'Neal added 18 points and two steals, and Coltie Young chipped in with 14 points and two steals.
- Zeke Cook pulled down five offensive rebounds to pace the Tiger's offense, which grabbed ten boards and turned them into 14 second-chance points.
- The Jackson State defense was a problem in the game, forcing 18 Missouri turnovers while committing 13. Those takeaways turned into 26 points on the other end of the floor. Evans' three steals led the way individually for the Tigers.
- The win over Missouri was Jackson State's first win over an SEC opponent since 1995, when they defeated LSU 87-76 on the road.
- Adams sank a buzzer-beater with three seconds left, which was his first buzzer-beater this season.
- The Jackson State defense forced 18 turnovers and scored 26 points off those turnovers.

- Jackson State cleaned up on the offensive glass, collecting ten offensive boards in the game that turned into 14 second-chance points.
- Jackson State got a game-high eight rebounds from Cook.

LOOK WHO'S BACK!

- The Tigers welcomed back all five of their starters from a year ago: Ken Evans, Coltie Young, Romelle Mansel, Chase Adams, and Zeke Cook, and they accounted for 1,510 of Jackson State's 2,232 total points a year.
- Evans led the team in scoring, averaging 11.3 ppg, 4.6 rebounds per game, and 86 assists.
- Young was the second-leading scorer, with 10.9 points per game and 3.6 rebounds per game.
- Mansel finished the year with 8.9 points per game, 31 block shots, and an average of 5.4 rebounds per game.
- Adams guided the team as the point guard and finished with 118 assists, 50 steals, and 8.0 points per game.
- Cook averaged 5.9 rebounds per game with 16 blocks and 35 steals.

2 DOGS 1 BONE

- The Jackson State men's basketball team lives on the 2 Dogs, 1 Bone philosophy.
- In the words of Coach Mo, "When you have two dogs in a kennel with one bone, the toughest and hungriest dog is going to get that bone."
- The team that works the hardest and puts in the most work will win the battle between the two teams.
- The Tigers have a championship mindset because they want to be the best team in the SWAC.

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Jackson State Tigers will clock quite a few miles on the road before the SWAC season begins. In fact, they will travel 14,126 miles before they play their first conference game.
- The travel is designed so the Tigers can grow together as a team on the road and learn how to play when traveling in the SWAC.
- The trips will test the mental toughness of the Tigers.
- JSU will play three games in five days in two different time zones to start the season.
- Following those three games, they will then play three more games over the next six days, all on the road.
- The Tigers play their first 13 games on the road, and they play in each time zone except Mountain Standard Time.

BIG FROM THE BENCH

- Coach Mo is looking for a big thing from the bench this year. He added some key players who he is expecting to give key minutes and play well when their time is called.
- Some of those players include Treyon Johnson, Keiveon Hunt, and Jalani Bell.
- The Tigers have scored 115 points off the bench to average 19.1 points per game from bench players.

TOUGH SLATE

- Jackson State opens the 2023-24 season by playing three games in five games by playing at Memphis, San Diego, and Cal Baptist.
- The Tigers will face ten teams that made the NCAA tournament a year ago, including a team in Houston that made it to the Sweet 16 last year and Gonzaga, who made it to the Elite Eight.
- They will travel on the road as they face all 10 of those teams, with the exception of Texas Southern, whom they will also play at home.
- Jackson State will also face two teams that are currently ranked in the top 25 in #6/6 Houston and #11/12 Gonzaga.

CHASE IS ABOUT SHARING

- Chase Adams is one of the best point guards in the country, and he can play with the best of them.
- He has recorded 21 assists in the short season and 139 assists in his two years at Jackson State.
- He is currently averaging 3.5 assists per game.
- His game-high is seven against San Diego earlier this season.
- Adams is on pace to crack the top 10 assists leaders list. Marino Walker is 10th with 271 assists.

EVANS & ADAMS EARN WEEKLY HONORS

- The Southwestern Athletic Conference has named Jackson State's Ken Evans and Chase Adams its SWAC Men's Basketball Players of the Week for their impressive performances during games played this past week.
- Evans Jr. scored a game-high 20 points for the Tigers during Jackson State's 73-72 upset win over Missouri. He scored 54 points on the week and also contributed eight assists and five steals for Jackson State.
- With time expiring, Adams went the length of the court to make a game-winning jumper for Jackson State to help lift



them to a 73-72 upset win over Missouri. It was the first SEC win for the program since a win over LSU in 1995.

SWAC PRESEASON HONORS

- Chase Adams, Romelle Mansel, and Ken Evans Jr. received Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) first and second-team preseason honors, while the Tigers were selected to finish fourth in the SWAC.
- Adams averaged 8.0 points, 3.7 assists, and 2.5 rebounds per game, and he shot over 80 percent from the charity stripe last season. He scored a JSU career-high 21 points in a road contest against Bethune-Cookman last season on his way to earning first-team SWAC preseason honors.
- Mansel averaged 8.9 points per game for the Tigers a year ago. He also had 5.4 rebounds and shot over 55 percent from the floor. Mansel scored his JSU career-high 24 points at Florida A&M and grabbed 14 rebounds against Abilene Christian.
- Evans Jr. led the Tigers last season with 11.3 ppg, as he started 31 of Jackson State's 32 games a season ago. He scored in double figures in 19 games last season, with two of those games scoring over 20 points. He opened the 2022-23 season by scoring double figures in the first six games.
- The Tigers, under the direction of second-year head coach Mo Williams, received 213 votes along with three first-place votes and were selected to finish fourth. Jackson State finished the 2022-23 season with a 14-19 overall record and a 12-6 record in league play, which was good enough for a third-place finish.

TEAM NOTES

TIGERS TO PLAY IN HBCU CHALLENGE

- The Chris Paul Family Foundation and Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame announced the third annual circuit of two Historically Black College and University (HBCU) events, the HBCU Tip-Off and Challenge, presented by the AEA Foundation.
- The HBCU Tip-Off will take place November 18-19 at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Connecticut, and the HBCU Challenge will be held December 16-17 at the Michelob ULTRA Arena at Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino in Las Vegas.
- Jackson State will face Howard and North Carolina A&T in Las Vegas, with both games being broadcast on ESPNU.

TIGER TAILS

- Coach Mo is in his third year as head coach and second at Jackson State, his hometown. Born in Jackson, Miss.
- Williams attended Murrah High School, where he had a successful career, earning him a scholarship to Alabama.
- In his first year at Jackson State, he went 12-6 in SWAC play despite being picked to finish seventh.
- Coach Williams has never faced Georgetown as a coach or player so this will be his first-ever meeting against the Hoyas.

TIGERS ON ESPN PLATFORMS

- Jackson State's men's basketball team will travel quite a bit to start the season, but fans will get a chance to see them on either ESPN+ or ESPNU.
- The Tigers' first six games will be on ESPN+, and they will have a total of eight of their non-conference games broadcast on ESPN+ and two on ESPNU.
- They will also play two home games on ESPNU when they host Texas Southern and Southern in the Williams Athletics and Assembly Center.

TIGERS ON JSU SPORTS NETWORK

- Rob Jay will host the JSU Sports Network broadcast of each Jackson State men's basketball home game.
- There will be many chances for fans to see the Tigers in action this season, including two games on HBCUGO.
- The Tigers will be on HBCUGO on three different occasions when they host Alcorn State on January 6, against Grambling on February 3, and finally against Mississippi Valley State on March 9 at home.

HEAD COACH MO WILLIAMS

SECOND SEASON AT JACKSON STATE • THIRD YEAR OVERALL • ALABAMA



Williams defied the odds of a predicted seventh-place finish in his first season as he led the Tigers to a tie for third place and a berth in the SWAC Tournament semifinals. A win over SMU sparked the Williams era during non-conference play en route to a 12-6 conference record.

SWAC play was highlighted by wins over eventual regular season co-champ Alcorn and eventual tournament champion Texas Southern, as JSU won seven of its last eight regular season games prior to the conference tournament.

The Jackson native and former Murrah High School star returned home as head coach of the Tigers after spending the previous two seasons as head coach at Alabama State University. In his final season, the Hornets ranked in the top four in the SWAC in scoring, assists, three-point field goal percentage, free throw percentage, and blocked shots.

Williams entered the coaching ranks at Cal-State Northridge as an assistant coach under his former college coach, Mark Gottfried, whom Williams played for at Alabama. Cal State Northridge led the Big West Conference in scoring in both seasons, setting school records for three-point field goals made, field goals made, fewest turnovers, and blocked shots.

Williams spent 14 years in the NBA, averaging over 13 points and nearly five assists per game. Drafted by Utah, Williams would play his rookie season with the Jazz before spending the next four seasons with the Milwaukee Bucks. Williams played three seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers (2008-11) where he teamed up with LeBron James and helped the Cavs post a league-best 66 wins in 2008-09 and a berth in the NBA Finals. Williams was selected to the NBA All-Star Game in his first season with Cleveland.

After stints with the Los Angeles Clippers (2011-12), Portland Trail Blazers (2013-14), Minnesota Timberwolves (2014-15) and Charlotte Hornets (2015), Williams returned to Cleveland for the 2015-16 campaign as the Cavaliers completed an historic comeback from a three-game-to-one deficit to defeat the Golden State Warriors to win the NBA Championship.

Williams was named Mr. Basketball during his senior year at Murrah High in 2001 and earned McDonald's All-America and Parade Magazine third-team All-America honors. He went on to play two seasons at Alabama, averaging more than 13 points and four assists per game. Williams was named Sporting News National Freshman of the Year and Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year in 2002, helping lead The Tide to the SEC regular season championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. Williams earned third-team all-conference accolades in 2003 before turning pro after his sophomore year.

Williams has seven sons – Kydarrius, Maurice, Michael, Mason, Maxwell, Asa, and Ezra. A native of Jackson (Miss.), he is the son of Griceldia and Isaiah Williams and has three siblings – Marcia, Michael (a West Point graduate) and Montrell. Williams is married to his wife, Antonia.
